**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 6-159 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO ISSUANCE OF TEMPORARY PERMITS FOR PARKING OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS**

**WHEREAS**, Section 6-159(b)(1) and (2) of the Municipal Code of the City of Des Peres makes it illegal to park or store any commercial vehicle, recreational equipment or house trailer on private property in residentially zoned areas of the City except if said vehicle is stored entirely within an enclosed garage or is parking in a rear or side yard and screened from view at normal eye level from any street or adjoining lot by fencing, landscaping or similar devices; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 6-159(b)(5) allows the owner to obtain a permit to park recreational equipment in a residentially zoned area for a period of seven (7) consecutive days or less if the owner of the property obtains the necessary permit from the Department of Public Works to allow extensions of said permit and fails to restrict the number of such permits which can be granted; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Aldermen desires to place a limit on the number of such permits which can be obtained annually from any given address within the City.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF DES PERES, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section One:** Paragraph (5) of subsection (b) of Section 6-159. *Parking and storage of commercial vehicles, recreational equipment and house trailers* is hereby amended, as follows:

Repeal of the following language:

Such permit shall be renewable for an additional seven-day period.

And the addition of the following new language:

**No property owner shall obtain more than three (3) such permits in any twelve (12) month period and provided that permit may not be issued so as to permit parking of such vehicles for more than fourteen (14) consecutive days.**



(5) Recreation equipment may be parked on private property in a residentially zoned area for a period of seven (7) consecutive days or less if the owner of such property obtains a permit from the Department of Public Works. No property owner shall obtain more than three (3) such permits in any twelve (12) month period and provided that permit may not be issued as to permit parking of such vehicles for more than fourteen (14) consecutive days.

[NOTE: Other subsections and paragraphs of Section 6-159 are not altered, amended or affected in any way by this amendment and shall remain in full force and effect. For that reason, these subsections are not set forth herein.]

**Section Two:** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect both from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen.


